A Coach trip to see the statue of St Piran in the Valley of the Saints is planned for the spring of 2019. The statue is the 100th to be installed in the valley in Brittany.

ITINERARY

Monday 1st April sail from Plymouth by Brittany ferries at 22.00hrs
2 nights in the Hotel de L'Europe in Morlaix including Breakfast and Dinner.
Returning on Thursday 4th April on the 16.30hrs sailing from Roscoff.

Cost of the trip £399 per person (single supplement £70)

Overnight cabin on the outward journey £25 per person

ST PIRAN CHURCHYARD PROJECT

St Piran's Churchyard is extensive, having been purposed for the whole Parish of Perranzabuloe, rather than a mere denomination. As such it is a rare historic gem, offering a one stop venue for those researching their Genealogy

As the churchyard is full for burials other than cremations, the responsibility shifted in the late 20th century, from the church to the council. While the council do a good job in keeping many of the areas accessible, with grass cutting. Financial pressures have led over the past years to some areas becoming inaccessible due to the growth of shrubs and brambles.

We hope to form a 'Friends of St Piran's Churchyard' group which will undertake to remove the shrubs and brambles, and to generally to keep the churchyard looking at its best throughout the year.

Advice has been sought from Cornwall Wildlife Trust and the Living Churchyard organisations. We have the agreement of the Parish council to proceed with this project.

We aim to make the churchyard that will meet the needs of those whose relatives are buried there and be a place where wildlife can flourish.

FRUITS OF FAITH PROJECT

An update following the July Cluster Service

On 9th August Fruits of Faith UK made a grant to Uganda to support the purchase of 3 acres of land. This is just the first instalment to enable the farmers cooperative to start working the land and planting coffee as a cash crop. The money raised from the coffee will be used to fund a medical clinic in Kyantale. The second medical mission held in Kyantale in July 2018 identified malaria as a particular problem in this area (in comparison to other parts of Uganda) so a medical clinic is much needed. The coffee profits will also help part-fund any future land purchases by the Community Development Group Fruits of Faith Uganda (FROFU). Robert from FROFU has asked that we convey their great appreciation for fundraising efforts in the UK in order to purchase this land.

The total grant is £3,423, we have just sent £1,895, leaving us with £610 in the UK account, so we have £917 to raise in the next 10 months.
