### Fruits of Faith

The first instalment towards purchasing 3 acres of land for Fruits of Faith Uganda was sent in August and the paperwork is underway.

Alongside the UK fundraising FROFU have raised £333 towards the purchase by leasing their pineapple plantation. The pineapples are an entirely Ugandan funded project and demonstrates great partnership working between the UK and Uganda. The women's cooperative have been involved in plans for the 3 acres and as well as coffee as a cash crop, some are interested in starting a piggery which can also be great for income generation. A further £900 still needs to be raised in the next 10 months for the final instalment for the land purchase (possibly more of the pound continues to fall in value).

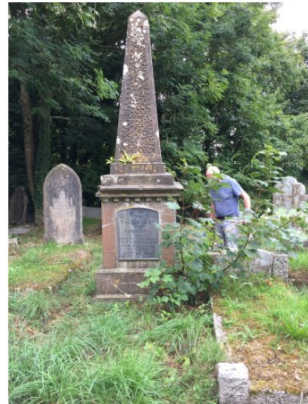


**Friends of St Piran's Churchyard**

Saturday September 1<sup>st</sup> 2018 saw the first working party active in the churchyard. A dozen people came to help clear and tidy the churchyard. Work was undertaken on areas, H, G, S, R and J



The monument below is to Abel Paul (right hand edge of area R) and his family who died 1870 before, during and after clearance



One area which had been totally inaccessible, (photo on left) in area J, adjoined to path, was cleared to reveal, 4 grave markers all of which were totally inaccessible. One of which was for Richard Ternery, (photo right) who Died 17<sup>th</sup> August 1869, recorded as '32 years clerk of this parish'



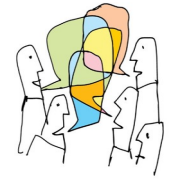
An area of the notice board inside the main porch of St Piran's has been set aside to record the work being undertaken and a log book to record the work activities undertaken is also there.

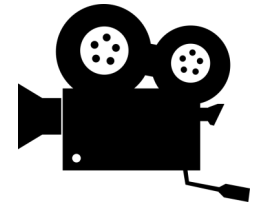
