Saturday October 6th dawned wet and windy, however this did not dishearten the band of friends who gathered at 10 o'clock in the church. A warm welcome and refreshments were offered by Mary and Jean.

A thicket, in the area of I-2, was identified as being an area of concern and a small band set to work. This revealed the hidden grave marker for the Warne family. It also allows access to the grave and children Mary Ann aged 4 and Elizabeth Ellen aged 2 and later their parent John and Elizabeth, also the grave of another Warne. Thomas killed in 1919 and displaying a photo and his war medal on the marker.

One volunteer worked hard to remove the heavy growth of ivy from the Rabey graves, situated in the area J-3.

Other members collected rubbish from around the sites notably the non-biodegradable remnants from wreaths and memorial flowers that cause significant problems to the council workers who do the grass cutting during the year. While others dealt with the removal of invasive saplings that are significantly damaging graves.

The AGM of the group was held on Monday 22nd October, the following were elected, J Bessell-Chairman, Anne Brown-Secretary, J Padbury-Co Secretary, Andrew Bown-Treasurer, T Hocking-Executive Member. A constitution was agreed. Full minutes are available in the Porch at St Piran's

FRUITS of FAITH



In August Fruits of Faith Uganda received the first instalment of a grant to buy 3 acres of land to be used as a cooperative cash crop to support the community becoming self sufficient. The Kyantale community were able to pay 1 million Uganda shillings of the 8 million, raised from renting out their pineapple plantation (an entirely Kyantale funded project). The land has started to be cleared to plant coffee. Once the coffee is planted it will take 2 years to get the first

yield. Coffee can then be harvested twice a year with an estimated value of £1,800 a year for this 3 acre plot. The community would like to invest in a local medical clinic. Many new people have joined the church and women's cooperative. After incredibly generous Harvest giving from St Agnes cluster and St Clements congregations, the final instalment to pay for the land will be sent in the coming weeks. Fruits of Faith Uganda and the people of Kyantale send their heartfelt thanks to those who gave to support their community."


